Whether or not you intend to attend the meeting, you are requested to complete the accompanying proxy form in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return the same to the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at 17th Floor, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the meeting (i.e. not later than 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, 22 July 2026) or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the proxy form will not preclude you from attending and voting at the meeting, or any adjourned meeting, should you so wish and in such event the proxy form shall be deemed to be revoked.

References to dates and time in this circular are to Hong Kong dates and time.

CHARACTERISTICS OF GEM OF THE STOCK EXCHANGE

GEM has been positioned as a market designed to accommodate small and mid-sized companies to which a higher investment risk may be attached than other companies listed on the Stock Exchange. Prospective investors should be aware of the potential risks of investing in such companies and should make the decision to invest only after due and careful consideration.

Given that the companies listed on GEM are generally small and mid-sized companies, there is a risk that securities traded on GEM may be more susceptible to high market volatility than securities traded on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange and no assurance is given that there will be a liquid market in the securities traded on GEM.

**PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATES
TO ISSUE NEW SHARES AND TO REPURCHASE SHARES,
PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS
AND
NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with the information in respect of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM including, among others, the granting to the Directors of the Share Issue Mandate and the Share Repurchase Mandate, the extension of the Share Issue Mandate and the re-election of retiring Directors; and to give you the notice of the AGM at which your approval of the relevant resolutions relating to these matters will be sought.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

2. SHARE ISSUE MANDATE

On 10 September 2025, a general mandate was granted to the Directors to exercise powers of the Company to allot and issue new Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed to approve the Share Issue Mandate in order to ensure flexibility and discretion to the Directors to issue new Shares.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had 480,000,000 Shares in issue. Subject to the passing of the resolution approving the Share Issue Mandate and assuming that no further Shares are issued and no Shares are repurchased and cancelled prior to the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the resolution approving the Share Issue Mandate to allot, issue or deal with a maximum of 96,000,000 additional Shares (including any sale and transfer of treasury shares out of treasury), representing not more than 20% of the total number of issued Shares (excluding treasury shares, if any) as at the Latest Practicable Date. An ordinary resolution to extend the Share Issue Mandate by adding the number of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate will also be proposed at the AGM.

The Directors do not have immediate plan to issue any new Shares pursuant to the Share Issue Mandate, except for those that may be allotted pursuant to the general mandate granted to the Directors on 10 September 2025 which will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. The Company will make further announcement(s) to keep its Shareholders and potential investors informed of any developments as and when appropriate.

Details of the Share Issue Mandate and the extension of the Share Issue Mandate are set out in ordinary resolutions nos. 4 and 6, of the notice of the AGM respectively.

3. SHARE REPURCHASE MANDATE

On 10 September 2025, a general mandate was granted to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. An ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM to approve the Share Repurchase Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had 480,000,000 Shares in issue. Subject to the passing of the resolution approving the Share Repurchase Mandate, assuming that no further Shares are issued and no Shares are repurchased and cancelled prior to the AGM, the maximum number of Shares which may be repurchased pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate will be 48,000,000 Shares, representing not more than 10% of the total number of issued Shares (excluding treasury shares, if any) as at the Latest Practicable Date.

The Directors do not have immediate plan to repurchase any Shares pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate but consider that the Share Repurchase Mandate will provide the Company with the flexibility to make such repurchase when appropriate and beneficial to the Company.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

An explanatory statement required under Rule 13.08 of the GEM Listing Rules, giving certain information regarding the Share Repurchase Mandate, is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

The Share Issue Mandate and the Share Repurchase Mandate, if approved at the AGM, will continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles of Association or any applicable laws to be held or until the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting, whichever is the earliest.

4. RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

The Board currently comprises nine Directors, namely Ms. Di Xiaoguang, Mr. Sen Zen, Ms. Qin Yue, Mr. Wong Wing Hoi, Mr. Cai Yue, Ms. Jiang Yurong, Ms. Li Xinjuan, Ms. Lau Wai Hing and Ms. Ho Sze Man Kristie.

In accordance with the Article 83(3), any Director so appointed shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting of the Company after his appointment and shall then be eligible for re-election at the meeting but shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation at such meeting.

In accordance with the Article 84, at each annual general meeting one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement at an annual general meeting at least once every three years. The Directors to retire by rotation shall include (so far as necessary to ascertain the number of directors to retire by rotation) any Director who wishes to retire and not to offer himself for re-election. Any further Directors so to retire shall be those of the other Directors subject to retirement by rotation who have been longest in office since their last re-election or appointment and so that as between persons who became or were last re-elected Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by lot. Any Director appointed by the Board pursuant to Article 83(3) shall not be taken into account in determining which particular Directors or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation.

In accordance with Article 83(3), Mr. Cai Yue and Ms. Jiang Yurong shall retire at the AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

In accordance with Article 84, Ms. Li Xinjuan, Ms. Lau Wai Hing and Ms. Ho Sze Man Kristie shall retire at the AGM by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

Recommendation of the Nomination Committee

In considering and proposing the re-election of the above retiring Directors at the AGM, the Nomination Committee has evaluated the performance of each of the retiring Directors and found their performance satisfactory. The Nomination Committee has assessed and received the annual independence confirmations pursuant to Rule 5.09 of the GEM Listing Rules from each of the independent non-executive Directors and consider that all of them, comprising Ms. Li Xinjuan, Ms. Lau Wai Hing and Ms. Ho Sze Man Kristie, remain independent. In addition, the Nomination Committee has considered the diversity of the Board from a range of diversity perspectives with reference to the Company's business and corporate strategy, including but not limited to gender, age, cultural and educational background, ethnicity, professional experience, skills, knowledge and length of service. All Board appointments are based on meritocracy, and candidates shall be considered with reference to the nomination criteria including talents, skills and experience as may be necessary for the operation of the Board as a whole, with a view to maintaining a sound balance of the Board's composition.

Therefore, the Nomination Committee nominated the retiring Directors to the Board for it to propose to Shareholders for re-election at the AGM. Accordingly, with the recommendation of the Nomination Committee, the Board has proposed that the retiring Directors, namely all Directors to stand for re-election as Directors at the AGM. The Nomination Committee considered that in view of their diverse and different educational backgrounds and professional knowledge and experience as set out in Appendix II to this circular, all of the Directors will bring valuable perspectives, knowledge, skills and experiences to the Board for its efficient and effective functioning and their appointments will contribute to the diversity (in particular in terms of skills) of the Board, and brings objective and independent judgement to the Board. Each of the retiring Directors has abstained from voting at the relevant Board meeting on the respective propositions of their recommendations for re-election by the Shareholders.

Biographical details of the above retiring Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

5. RE-APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR OF THE COMPANY

The Board, with the recommendation from the Audit Committee, proposes to re-appoint Baker Tilly Hong Kong Limited ("**Baker Tilly**") as the auditor of the Company for the ensuing year, subject to the approval by the Shareholders at the AGM.

The Audit Committee has considered a number of factors in assessing the proposed re-appointment of Baker Tilly as the auditor of the Company in accordance with its terms of reference, including but not limited to (i) Baker Tilly's audit proposal and audit fee; (ii) its experience, industry knowledge and technical competence in providing audit work for companies listed on the Stock Exchange; (iii) its independence from the Group and objectivity; (iv) its market reputation; (v) its resources and capabilities; and (vi) the relevant guidance issued by the Hong Kong Accounting and Financial Reporting Council.

The estimated audit fee of Baker Tilly for the audit of the consolidated financial statements of the Company and its subsidiaries for the year ending 31 March 2027 is expected to be approximately HK\$920,000, which is determined with reference to the proposed audit scope, the Company's current size, complexity and risk profile and the expected level of effort and timeline of the audit, and on the assumption that there will be no material change to the Company's business. The Audit Committee noted that the proposed audit fee is determined after arm's length negotiations. The Audit Committee and the Board consider that the proposed re-appointment, driven by the estimated audit fee, is commensurate with the audit effort required to maintain a high standard of audit quality.

The Board and the Audit Committee have reviewed the qualifications, competence and experience of Baker Tilly and consider that Baker Tilly (i) meets the regulatory requirements, and (ii) is eligible and suitable to act as the auditor of the Company. Unless there is a material change in the basis or assumptions set out above, the final audit fee is not expected to deviate materially from the estimated range. In the event of any material change, the Company will make further disclosure as appropriate. The Board considers the estimated audit fee to be fair and reasonable based on the information currently available.

Based on the above, the Board and the Audit Committee have assessed and considered that Baker Tilly is eligible and suitable to act as the auditor of the Company.

6. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The notice of the AGM is set out on pages 21 to 25 of this circular.

7. CLOSURE OF REGISTER OF MEMBERS

For determining the eligibility to attend and vote at the AGM, the register of members of the Company will be closed from Tuesday, 21 July 2026 to Friday, 24 July 2026, both days inclusive, during which period no transfer of Shares will be registered and no Share will be issued upon exercise of the share options granted by the Company. In order to qualify for attendance and voting at the meeting, all completed transfer forms accompanied by the relevant share certificates must be lodged with the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at 17/F, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong for registration no later than 4:30 p.m. on Monday, 20 July 2026. The record date for the purpose of determining the eligibility of the Shareholders to attend and vote at the AGM is Friday, 24 July 2026.

8. PROXY ARRANGEMENT

A proxy form for use at the AGM is enclosed with this circular. Such proxy form is also published on the websites of the Stock Exchange (www.hkexnews.hk) and the Company (www.elephant8635.com). Whether or not you intend to attend the AGM, you are requested to complete the proxy form in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return the same to the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at 17/F, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the AGM (i.e. not later than 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, 22 July 2026) or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the proxy

form will not preclude you from attending and voting at the AGM, or any adjourned meeting, should you so wish and in such event the proxy form shall be deemed to be revoked.

9. VOTING BY WAY OF POLL

Pursuant to Rule 17.47(4) of the GEM Listing Rules and Article 66, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll except where the chairman of the meeting, in good faith, decides to allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands. The chairman of the AGM will therefore demand a poll for every resolution put to the vote at the AGM and the Company will announce the results of the poll in the manner prescribed under Rule 17.47(5) of the GEM Listing Rules.

To the best of the Directors' knowledge, information and belief having made all reasonable enquiries, no Shareholders are required to abstain from voting on the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

10. RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the GEM Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief, the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

11. RECOMMENDATION

The Directors believe that the granting of the Share Issue Mandate, the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate, the extension of the Share Issue Mandate, the re-election of the retiring Directors and the re-appointment of auditor of the Company are in the best interests of the Company as well as the Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Directors recommend that all the Shareholders should vote in favour of all the relevant resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

12. MISCELLANEOUS

The English text of this circular shall prevail over the Chinese text for the purpose of interpretation.

The following is an explanatory statement required by the GEM Listing Rules to provide the Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the granting of the Share Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

Exercise in full of the Share Repurchase Mandate, on the basis of 480,000,000 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and on the basis that no Shares will be allotted, issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, would result in up to 48,000,000 Shares (which must be fully paid and represent 10% of the Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date) being repurchased by the Company during the course of the period prior to the earliest of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; or (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles of Association or applicable laws of the Cayman Islands to be held; or (iii) the passing of any ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting of the Company revoking, varying or renewing the Share Repurchase Mandate.

If the Company purchases any Shares pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate, the Company will either (i) cancel the Shares repurchased and/or (ii) hold such Shares in treasury, subject to market conditions and the Company's capital management needs at the relevant time any repurchases of Shares are made.

To the extent that any treasury shares are deposited with CCASS pending resale on the Stock Exchange, the Company will adopt appropriate measures to ensure that it does not exercise any Shareholders' rights or receive any entitlements which would otherwise be suspended under the applicable laws if those shares were registered in the Company's own name as treasury shares. These measures may include approval by the Board that (i) the Company would not (or would procure its broker not to) give any instructions to Hong Kong Securities Clearing Company Limited to vote at general meetings for the treasury shares deposited with CCASS, (ii) in the case of dividends or distributions, the Company will withdraw the treasury shares from CCASS, and either re-register them in its own name as treasury shares or cancel them, in each case before the record date for the dividends or distributions; and (iii) take any other appropriate measures to ensure that it will not exercise any Shareholders' rights or receive any entitlements which would otherwise be suspended under the applicable laws if those Shares were registered in its own name as treasury shares.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that the grant of the Share Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders.

Repurchases of Shares would only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at that time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value of the Company and/or its earnings per Share.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASE

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the memorandum of association of the Company, the Articles of Association, the Companies Act and any applicable laws and regulations. Pursuant to the Share Repurchase Mandate, repurchases will be made out of funds of the Company legally permitted to be utilised in this connection, including funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose of the repurchase or, in the case of any premium payable on the repurchase, out of funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the share premium account of the Company. The Company may not repurchase securities on GEM for a consideration other than cash or for settlement otherwise than in accordance with the trading rules of GEM prevailing from time to time.

4. IMPACT OF SHARE REPURCHASE

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited financial statements contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2026) in the event that the Share Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Share Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or on the gearing position of the Company which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

5. TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares under the Share Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning under the Takeovers Code), depending on the level of increase in the interest of the Shareholder(s), could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become(s) obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date and to the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors based on the register kept by the Company under Section 336 of the SFO, Ms. Di Xiaoguang, together with her associates and parties acting in concert with her (“**Ms. Di’s Group**”), directly or indirectly, own an aggregate of 163,060,000 Shares, representing approximately 33.97% of the issued share capital of the Company. Upon full exercise of the Share Repurchase Mandate and assuming that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the date of the AGM, the aggregate shareholding of Ms. Di’s Group would be increased to approximately 37.75% of the issued share capital of the Company. Such an increase would give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.
